When to Use "Ser"

Common Uses of "Ser": "Ser" is used in various contexts, primarily to describe permanent or defining qualities.

- **Identity:** To identify people or things. Example: "Ella es doctora." (She is a doctor.)
- **Characteristics:** To describe physical or personality traits. Example: "El coche es rojo." (The car is red.)
- **Origin:** To indicate where someone or something is from. Example: "Soy de España." (I am from Spain.)
- **Time:** To express time and dates. Example: "Son las tres." (It is three o'clock.)



Estar

Uses and Examples

Position	Yo estoy en la ciudad de Nueva York. I am in New York City.
Location	Él está al lado del escritorio. He is next to the desk.
Action	Nosotros estamos corriendo. We are running.
Condition	Ella está saludable. She is healthy.
Emotion	Usted es feliz. You are happy.

When to Use "Estar"

Common Uses of "Estar": "Estar" is used for temporary situations and conditions.

- **Temporary States:** To describe feelings or conditions that can change. Example: "Estoy cansado." (I am tired.)
- **Locations:** To indicate the physical location of people or things. Example: "El libro está en la mesa." (The book is on the table.)
- **Ongoing Actions:** To describe actions currently in progress (using the present continuous). Example: "Estoy estudiando." (I am studying.)

Comparison of Ser and Estar

Identity & Occupation	Ella es ingeniera. (She is an engineer.)	—
Physical/Personality Traits	La casa es grande. (The house is big.)	La casa está limpia. (The house is clean – temporary condition.)
Origin/Nationality	Yo soy colombiano.	—
Location	La fiesta es en mi casa. (For events)	Estoy en la oficina. (For identifying where a person is)
State or Condition	—	El café está caliente. (The coffee is hot.)

Parts of Speech in Spanish

Los Artículos

Articles draw special attention to the noun that they precede. The two types are **definite** and **indefinite**.

Los sustantivos

Nouns, or *sustantivos*, can be objects, feelings, and concepts. They are names that **identity objects**.

Los Adjetivos

Adjectives describe nouns. They **help describe** people, places, and the things around you.

Los Verbos

Los verbos describe **an action or a state** of being.

Los Adverbios

Adverbs **add a description to verbs**. Adverb even has the word "verb" inside of it!

Los Pronombres

A pronoun is essentially a word that **substitutes** a noun.

Las Preposiciones

Prepositions explain the **relationships between nouns**. They are often referring to a location.

Las conjunciones

Conjunctions are words that **connect** nouns, verbs, phrases, and sentences. There are simple and complex.

Las Interjecciones

Interjections are **abrupt remarks** that help you to express different emotions.
